Financial Information



- **Currently anticipating a balanced budget**
 - \$14,691,560 for FY 2011
 - Previous year's was \$16,383,112
 - State currently owes us about \$ 700,000
 - ✦ *Operating Funds Only*

- **Reduced Expenditures by about 11%, plan to decrease another 5% or so for 2012**
 - Approximately 40 positions eliminated over two years. Nearly 20% of the staff

- **Eliminated a few extra curricular programs or looked for volunteer coaches/sponsors, etc.**
- **Great many volunteers stepped forward to assist us**
- **Looking to expand advertising opportunities**
 - ✦ Poplar Grove State Bank stepped up for us

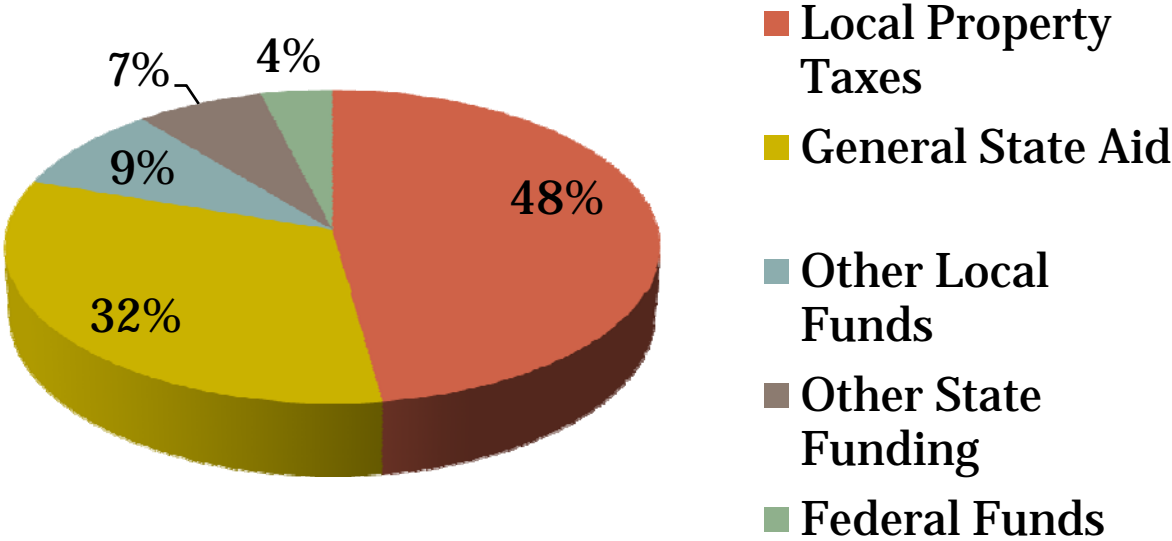

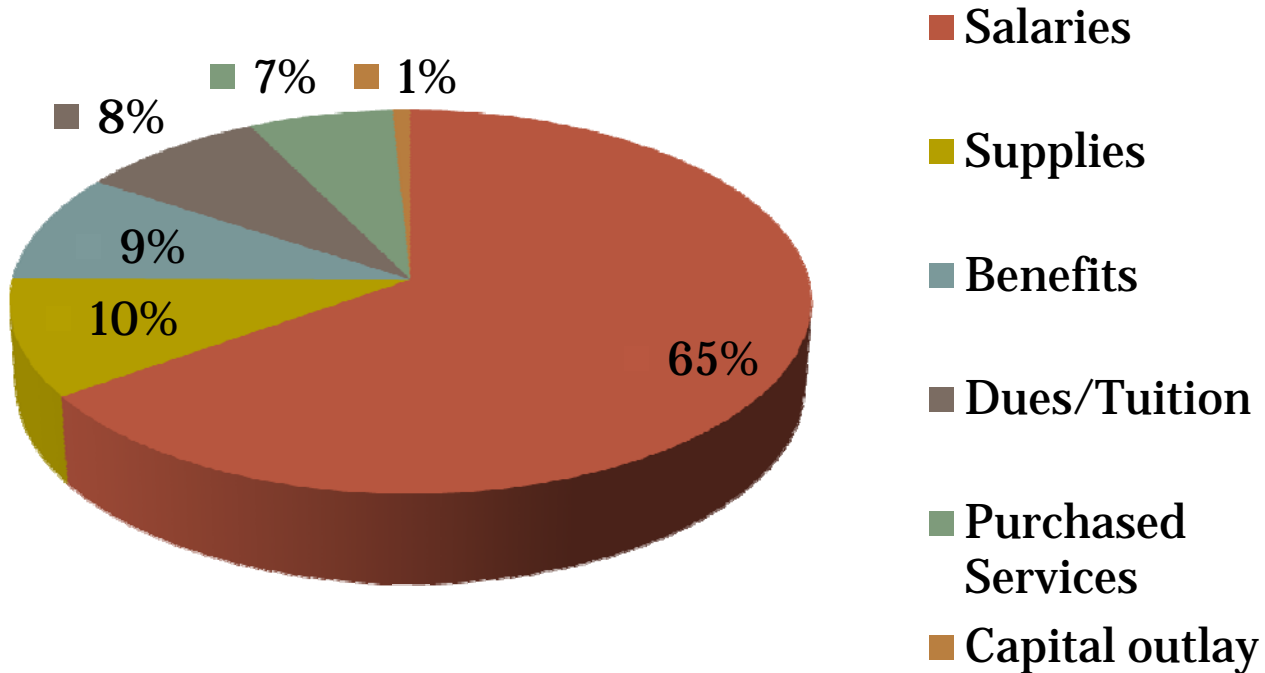
- **2009 tax rate was 4.8505**

North Boone Expenditures by Type (FY2011)





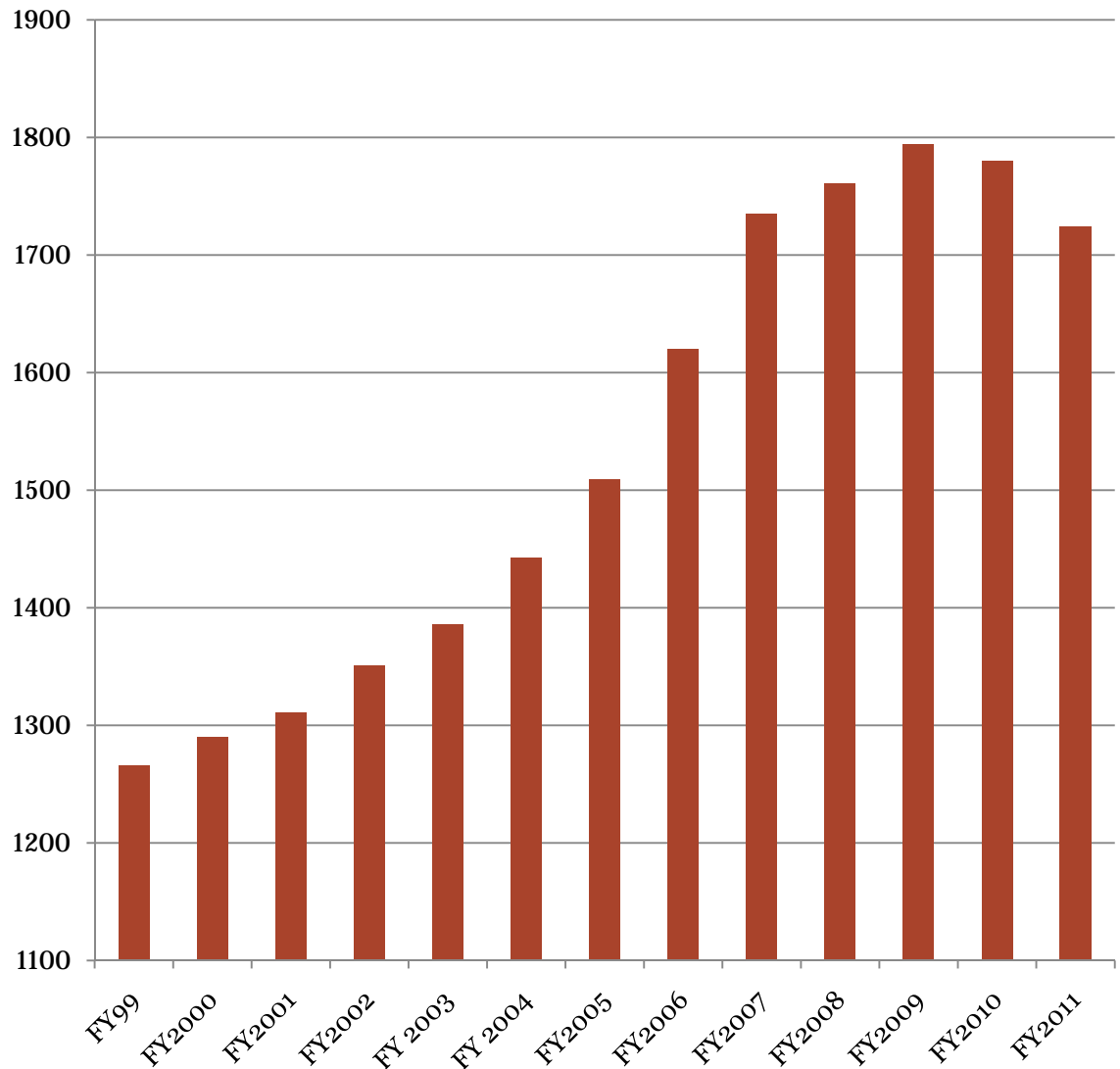
Enrollment

Currently there are a number of potential subdivisions that are not actively expanding

These could add as many as 3000 additional students to the district when fully built out

Hispanic population is rising within the district

Poverty rate is increasing as well

Currently have space for about 2550 students

- Previous demographic trend data from the 2005 Facilities Task Force anticipated new growth at significantly higher levels
 - 3519 by FY 2009
- 4722 total enrollment projections based upon extant subdivisions in March 2005 and existing dwellings

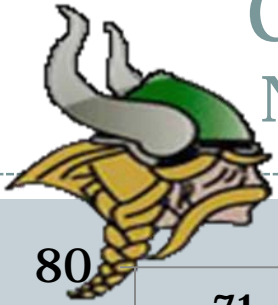

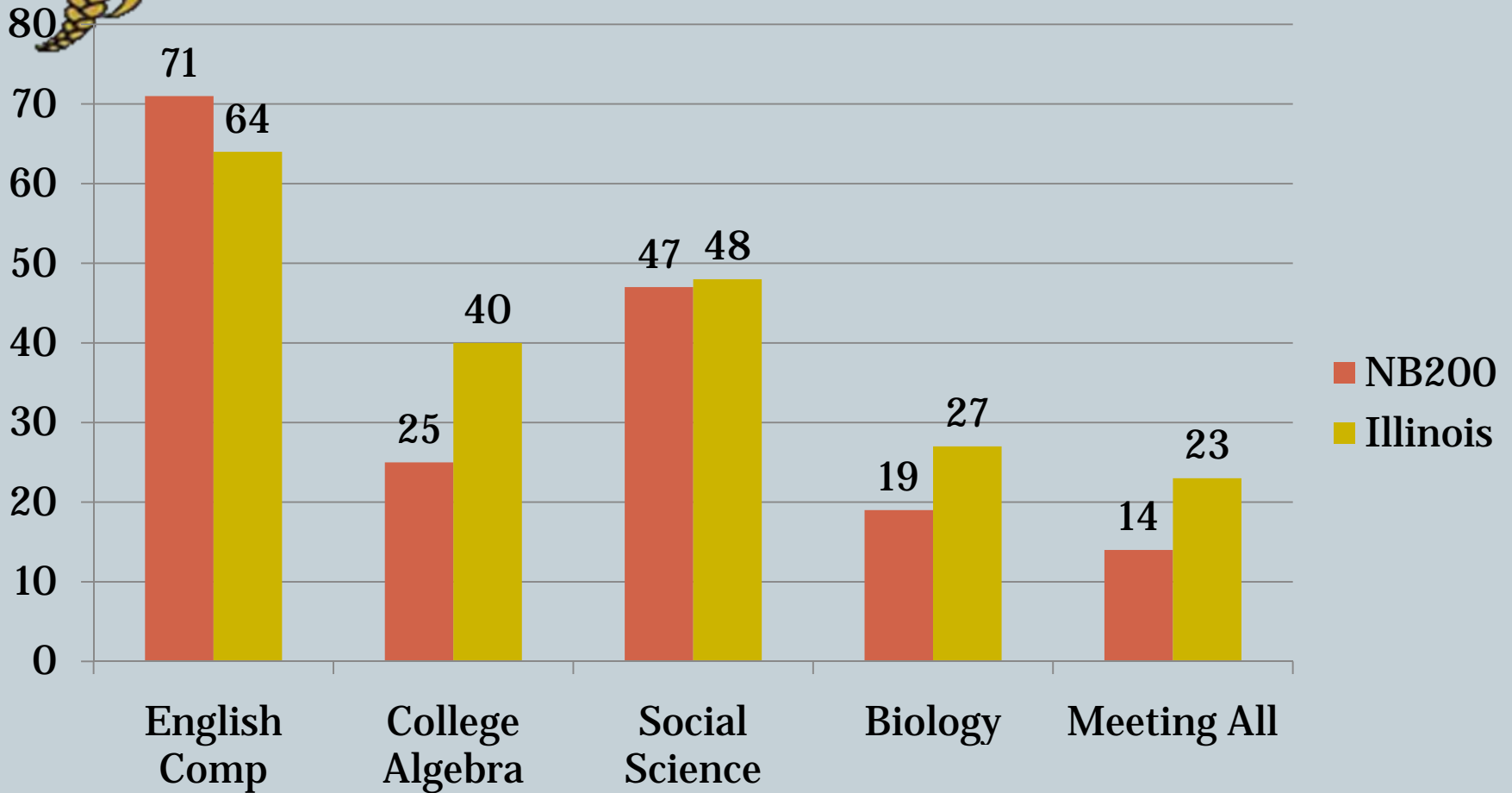

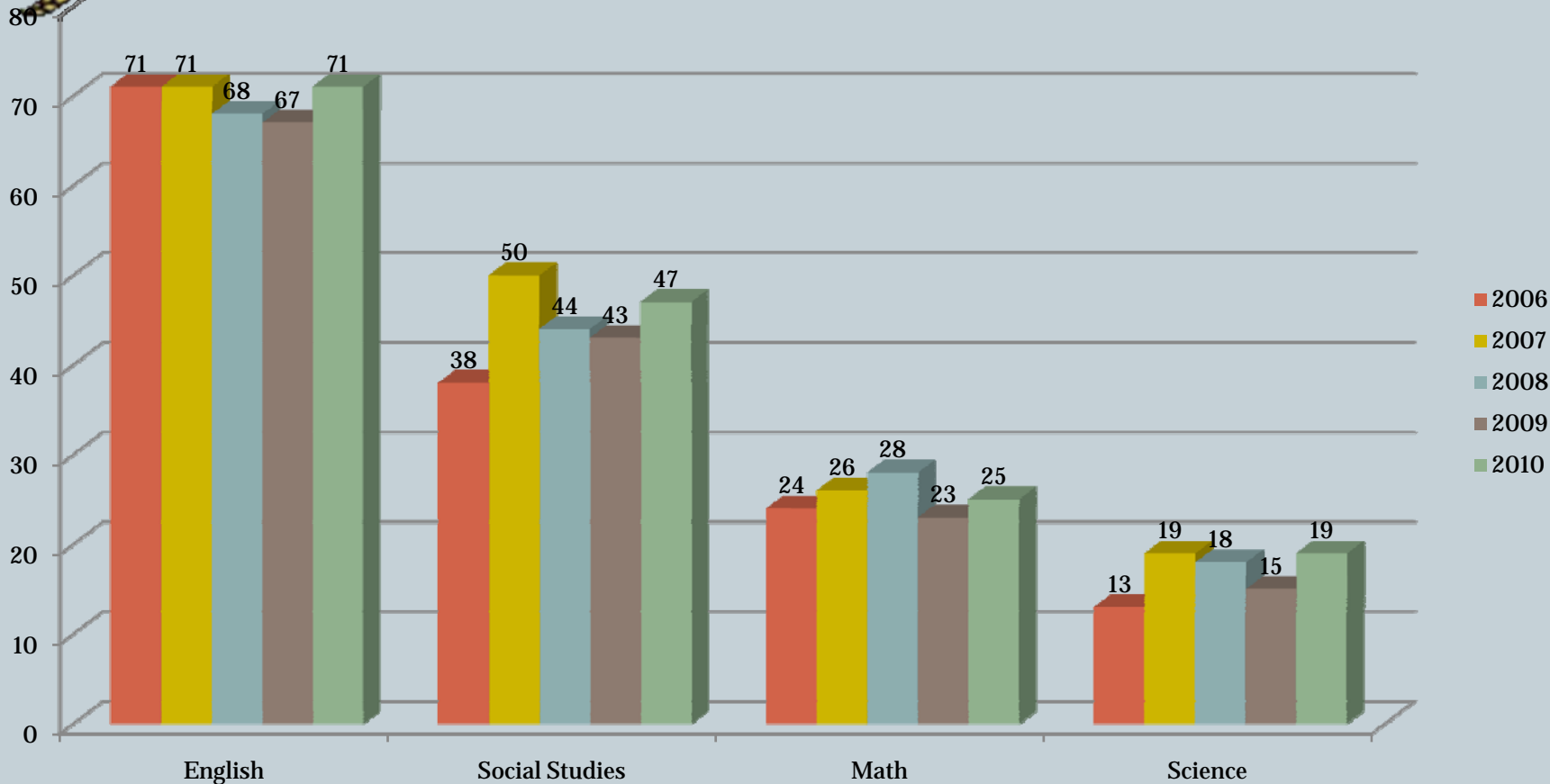


College Readiness (according to ACT)

NBHS Class of 2010 (as percent of test takers)



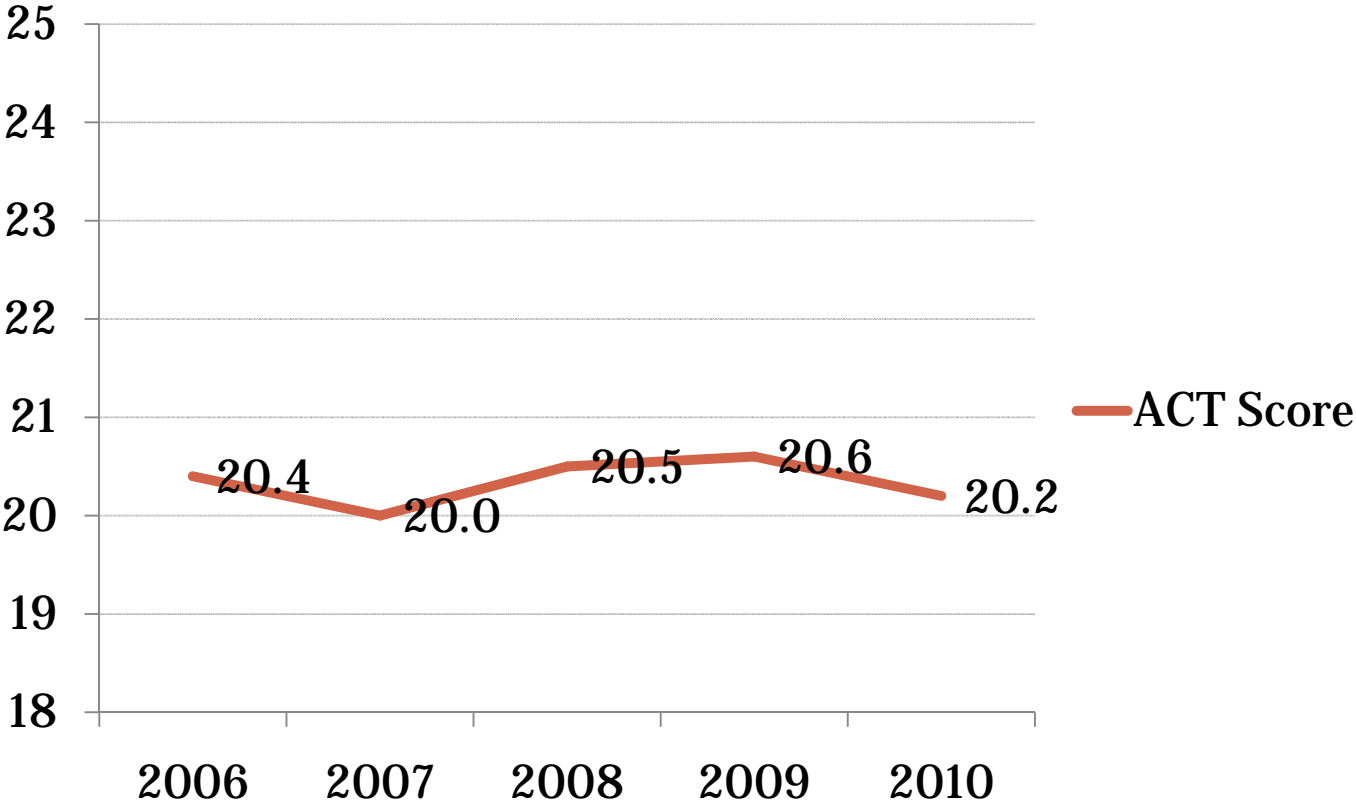
College Readiness as Measured by the ACT

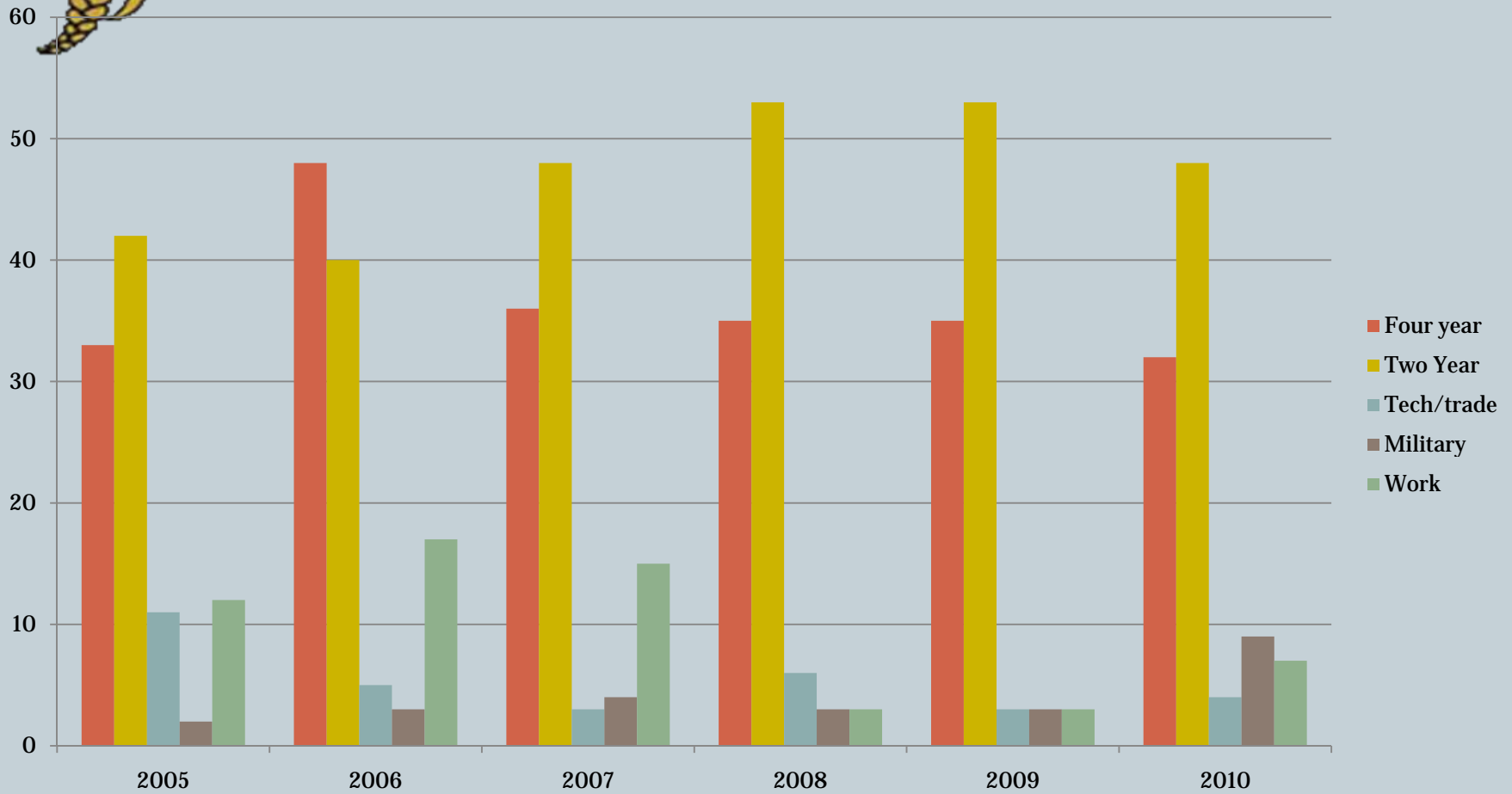
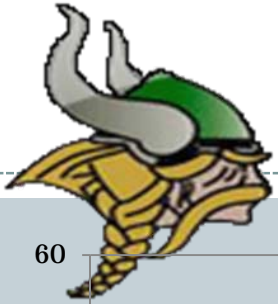
NBHS Class of 2011

Facilities Concerns



- **Infrastructure in the PK-4 and 7-8 levels are aged**
 - Aging building systems
 - Lack of air conditioning
 - Inadequate small group spaces
 - Security, particularly control of entrances
- **None of the elementary buildings are fully ADA accessible**
- **Small spaces needed for special education, RTI, ESL, etc. are not present**
- **Library and computer labs are out of date; classroom technology needs to be upgraded in some buildings**
