- Receive and read news sources like the Chicago Tribune, USA Today, the Wall Street Journal, the Christian Science Monitor, the New York Times and 100's of others for FREE every day!
- Send an article I find online to my Kindle to read later.
- Follow RSS feeds of my favorite blogs or news sources or writers.
- Search the internet and read articles on websites without all the extra advertisements etc. getting in the way.
- Prepare and organize all my materials for a research paper.
- Read library books.
- Read any Word document or PDF document.
- Play games like scrabble or solitaire, do word searches, complete logic puzzles like Sudoku or picture puzzles.
- Use the text-to-speech feature to auto page turn my books so I can read while exercising.
- And of course, read BOOKS! (Most of which I get for free.)
