2018 SANTA'S VILLAGE READER OF THE PACK INCENTIVE PROGRAM

Capron Elementary School students, grades PRE-K-4, will be participating in the Santa's Village Reader of the Pack Incentive Program. This program is designed to encourage recreational reading for students. Any student who reaches their reading goal and turns in the completed form is eligible for a one day, free admission ticket to Santa's Village for the 2018 season.

EARLY ABSENCES LEAD TO SCHOOL PROBLEMS LATER.

You woke up late and you wonder whether or not to take your child to school. After all, will one absence matter? The answer is yes! A large-scale review of research shows that children put their entire school career at risk when they are absent in the early years. The learning they miss is hard to make up.

Still, it can be a challenge to get a family out the door on time. Here's how:

- Get ready the night before. Lay out what your child will wear. Make sure your child has everything packed to take to school.
- Establish routines. Create a Chart of the things your child needs to do each day. When it's a routine, there is less chance for an argument.
- Allow extra time. Set your alarm clock a few minutes early. Allow yourself an extra five or ten minutes to get your child to school.

Kindergarten Registration

Registration for 2018-19 kindergarteners will be held during Parent/ Teacher conferences on February 7 and 15 from 4-7 p.m. Your child must be five by September 1, 2018, in order to register. When you register, please bring your

child's birth certificate. Parents must present two forms of proof that they reside in the attendance zone in which they are enrolling their student. Acceptable proofs are listed on the District website. Before your child can enter school, he or she must have a physical examination. You may register without a physical examination. However, doctor appointments should be made as early as possible as appointments for physicals are limited. Questions? Contact the school office.

English Language Learner Program News

Capron students who are working to learn English as their second language have just completed ACCESS testing. The ACCESS test measures students' abilities in listening, reading, writing, and speaking English. ACCESS stands for Assessing Comprehension and Communication in English State-to-State for English Language Learners. The kindergarten level test is done individually with the teacher. Fourth grade students take the entire test on the computer. First, second, and third graders take most of the test on the computer and complete the writing portion of the test on paper. Our students worked very hard to do their best.

Before ACCESS testing, students in grades 2-4 began the new year working in English on a study of the world's different habitats. Students read about different land habitats including rain forests, deserts, plains, tundra, and deciduous forests. Students also read about water habitats including lakes, rivers, oceans, and marshes. After reading, students chose one land habitat and one water habit to compare and contrast. Each student wrote a comparative essay on habitats in English. With ACCESS testing complete, students will continue the study of habitats working in Spanish. Please ask them to share what they are learning about habitats and essay writing.


