Read Aloud Tips

Reading aloud, for 15 or 20 minutes a day, is very important because it builds your child's desire to read. Whether your child is already reading or hasn't yet begun, it is a great time to start reading aloud regularly. Here are a few tips to help you get the most out of your reading aloud time together. *Encourage Participation: Take turns saying the lines in a dramatic or silly voice. Stop occasionally and ask if your child can predict what will happen next. *Get Comfortable: Offer your child soft mats or pillows to sit on. *Remove Distractions: Make your reading spot as quiet as possible so your child can focus on the story. Consider turning off the television to avoid interruptions.

Cold and flu season

Please remember if your child has a fever, they must remain fever free for 24 hours without the use of medication before they can return to school. Please do not medicate your child and send them to school if they have a fever. The same rule applies to diarrhea and/or vomiting. This is to help prevent the spread of illness to other students and staff. This district policy will be strictly enforced.
