

Important

What should you do when your child will be absent?

Call the School and report the absence. When you call please provide your full name, your child's name, state date of absence, and reason for absence. Please report if the child has a fever (degree of temp), cough or sore throat. If the student misses due to a medical appointment, please get a doctor's excuse.

***Note: If your child is absent four or more days due to a medical reason, a note from the doctor will be required to return to school. If your child comes to school without the Dr. note the child will be sent home.

Lunch Accounts



As we get to the end of the school year please make sure your children have enough money in their lunch accounts. All negative balances need to be taken care of before school is out for the summer. Any left over money will stay in their accounts for the children to use next year.



During the last week of school, it is a good idea to send in at least one large bag (paper grocery, or reusable grocery bag) for your child's teacher to send things home in.
