Preschool Screenings



Preschool screenings are Wednesday February 10th from 8:00 am-11:00 am & Wednesday March 10th 12:00 pm-2:00 pm . This is open to all 3 and 4 year olds who live in the North Boone School District. <u>Parents must make an</u> <u>appointment</u> for their child and must call 815-569-2314 between 8:00 AM-3:30 PM to set this up.

Please make sure that you are screening for Covid 19 symptoms before sending your child to school.

Kindergarten Registration



Registration for 2021-22 kindergarteners will start soon . Your child must be five by September 1, 2021, in order to register. When you register, please submit your child's birth

certificate. Parents must upload two forms of proof that they reside in the attendance zone in which they are enrolling their student.

Acceptable proofs are listed on the District website. Before your child can enter school, he or she must have a physical examination. You may register without a physical examination. However, doctor appointments should be made as early as possible as appointments for physicals are limited. Questions? Contact the school office. 815-569-2314

Expectations for a Safe Bus Ride

Riding the bus is a privilege and students are expected to abide by the following expectations for a safe bus ride:

- Be safe while waiting for and getting on and off the bus
- Wait for the bus to stop completely
- Walk instead of run
- Be patient and maintain 6ft of distance as you and others get on and off
- Masks must be worn while on the bus
- Listen to the bus driver since s/he is in charge of the bus
- Stay safe on the bus by:
- Staying in your assigned seat
- Buckling your seatbelt correctly
- Sitting correctly in your seat
- Not reaching out the window
- Treat others with respect while riding the bus
- Keep your bus clean and safe for everyone. Eating food on the bus is not allowed.
- If there is a problem on the bus it is important to let the bus driver know

Remember that the bus driver is focused on the safety of everyone and should not be distracted while driving unless an emergency is being reported

Remote Learners

• Congrats on learning how to navigate this tricky way of learning. You are doing great! It is really fun for us to see you during your live sessions.

• Please remember to be ready for your sessions on time. Being ready means that you are logged on, have removed distractions from your learning area, put away all food and drinks, and have the needed school supplies ready to go.

• Keep your computer on mute until you are ready to speak. Keep in mind when your computer is not on mute, the entire classroom is hearing all noises from your home. Family discussions can be distracting.

• Remote student attendance is determined by the students' completion of the class participation for the day, whether it is one or more live sessions.

• If your child is ill and cannot participate, please inform your child's teacher and the office in the morning.

Classroom teachers will let you know if there are books or materials to pick up. When necessary, you will have contactless pick up in front of the school. Please come during office hours, 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

Health Update

Please do not send your student and notify the school if:

- Your child is feeling ill or has a fever
- Your child is being tested for Covid-19
- Your child has tested positive for Covid-19 and has been told to isolate
- You have a positive Covid-19 case in your household
- Your child has been exposed to a positive Covid-19 person
- Your child has been identified as a close contact and has been told to quarantine

*If your student is in virtual mode, please remember to notify the school when your child is ill. The reason why it is so important that you continue to report to the school is, it gives North Boone Schools and Boone County Health a more accurate count of students and families that may be affected by COVID-19.
