### Read Aloud Tips

Reading aloud, for 15 or 20 minutes a day, is very important because it builds your child's desire to read. Whether your child is already reading or hasn't yet begun, it is a great time to start reading aloud regularly. Here are a few tips to help you get the most out of your reading aloud time together. \*Encourage Participation: Take turns saying the lines in a dramatic or silly voice. Stop occasionally and ask if your child can predict what will happen next. \*Get Comfortable: Offer your child soft mats or pillows to sit on. \*Remove Distractions: Make your reading spot as quiet as possible so your child can focus on the story. Consider turning off the television to avoid interruptions.

### Cold and flu season

Please remember if your child has a fever, they must remain fever free for 24 hours without the use of medication before they can return to school. Please do not medicate your child and send them to school if they have a fever. The same rule applies to diarrhea and/or vomiting. This is to help prevent the spread of illness to other students and staff. This district policy will be strictly enforced. Remember the key to staying germ free is washing your hands frequently, covering coughs and sneezes, staying home when you or your child are ill .



### Reminders for In-Person Learners

- Please make sure that you are screening for Covid 19 symptoms before sending your child to school.
- We recognize that family situations change from week to week for various reasons, and we will accommodate weekly dismissal plans as needed. Those plans need to be in the office by 10 a.m. That gives us time to communicate with all stakeholders.
- Please consider putting a spare mask in your child's backpack. Some students are experiencing mask malfunctions during the school day.

### Reminders for Remote Learners

- Congrats on learning how to navigate this tricky way of learning. You are doing great! It is really fun for us to see you during your live sessions.
- Please remember to be ready for your Google meets on time. Being ready means that you are logged on, have removed distractions from your learning area, put away all food and drinks, and have the needed school supplies ready to go.
- Keep your computer on mute until you are ready to speak. Keep in mind when your computer is not on mute, the entire classroom is hearing all noises from your home. Family discussions can be distracting.
