A Note From Our Principal

Dear Parents/Guardians,

What a wild winter we have had so far! It has been many years since I have experienced missing this much school for the weather. Our students have also been having a lot of indoor recess with the frigid temperatures. I know they look forward to being outside to play and back on the playground soon. I know I do!

Thank you for your patience in the morning and afternoon with the extra car riders lately. It is very important that we keep all of our kids safe. I have noticed some traffic concerns in the morning, and I want to remind all parents that drop off should come along the south side of the building or along the west side only after buses have gone through. In order to keep all of our students safe while walking to the building, please avoid turning around or pulling into the long yellow lines by door A during the school day. Your kindness and patience with helping our students get to and from school safely does not go unnoticed. Thank you!

We will start Illinois Assessment of Readiness (IAR) in early March. This was formerly the PARCC test and is the statewide assessment based on the Illinois Learning Standards. Our third and fourth graders will take multiple sessions of the IAR test over a two week window. Your child's teacher will inform you when their class is testing.

Please consider these three steps to supporting your child through testing.
1. Encourage your child to work hard and try his/her best to show how much he/she has learned. Be cautious not to over stress doing well, but continually encourage to try hard.

2. Limit night time activities on testing eves. Being out or up too late can affect how kids do on tests. To the extent possible, stick to normal bed-times and set an alarm in the morning to not be too rushed.

3. There is something to be said for a good healthy breakfast on the day of the test. Choose energy boosting foods with protein, such as eggs, milk, or yogurt, and healthy carbohydrates, such as fruit, oatmeal, or toast.
