# A Note From Our Principal

Dear Families,

I want to sincerely thank you for supporting us with our fundraising efforts by selling Cookie Dough and Butter Braids. Whether you helped your child to sell one item or twenty, we appreciate your support. We were able to raise \$2400 to support additional educational materials and programming here at Manchester. We are looking forward to seeing everyone at conferences. Please remember that although we set aside two nights in October and two nights in February for conferences, you can still reach out to us for any needed meetings at other times. We realize that educating children is a team effort and appreciate the part families play on the team.

As I walk around the school, I hear many teachers and students talking about mistakes and how important they are. We talk about having a growth mindset. This is the belief that anyone can improve and that mental capabilities are not fixed in place. Brain research has shown that when a mistake is made, our brains are more active and grow more pathways. Although it is nice to answer things correctly, making mistakes helps us all to learn. The important part is helping students learn from their errors. So how can you do this at home? Point out the mistakes, but don't gloss over them. Help your child to understand where he/she went wrong by having them review their work, offer suggestions, and encourage him/her to go to the teacher for help. While doing this, it is also important to praise progress. After reviewing mistakes, help your child to see that he/she is learning and improving. Paying attention to past mistakes and correcting them makes a difference. The more a child sees this, the more that child will believe in his/her ability to improve.


