#### General School Info

Welcome back! We hope you had an enjoyable summer. We were excited to see all of our returning students, and it has been fun getting to know our new students. They are a wonderful addition to the PG family!

This will be our only paper newsletter. It is available on our website at www.nbcusd.org each month. If you need a paper copy in the future we will have them available in the office.

Just a few notes to pass on from the school office.

- Our school day starts at 8:00 am and ends at 2:45 pm. Walkers will be dismissed at 2:40 pm. Students are marked tardy if they arrive after 8:00 am (unless they ride a bus). Please have them come to the office for a late pass.
- If your child is absent from school, please notify the office by 9:00 am. You may call (815)765-3113 or email the office at **Mpiskie@nbcusd.org.** If you know your child is going to be absent for more than a day, please stop by the office and fill out a pre-arranged absence form.
- Lunches are \$2.25/day full price and \$.40 for reduced. Milk may be purchased for cold lunches for \$.40.
- We are serving breakfast at 7:45 each morning. The cost is \$1.50 for full price and .\$30 for reduced. All students are welcome for breakfast. You do not need to sign up ahead of time.
- We have forms available for students who carry a cell phone. Please have your child request a form from the office. As a reminder, all student cell phones should be turned off during the school day.
- Please sign in at the office and get a visitors pass if you are going to walk your child to the classroom. Thank you for helping keep our students safe!
- The safety of our students is important, and from time to time we will practice
  for certain unlikely situations. We will have tornado, fire, bus evacuation and
  intruder drills. Many times we have our local fire department and law enforcement present to help. Please discuss the importance of these drills with your
  child.



#### **Notes From The Nurse**

- Attention Parents/Guardians of North Boone School District 200 Students: All students in the North Boone School District will have their vision and hearing screened by an Illinois Public Health Department Certified Technician. If there are any parents/guardians who do not want their child screened, they must submit that refusal in writing to their school prior to September 10, 2012.
- Head lice season is here again! All measures possible are being implemented to keep this condition under control. Itching is the earliest and most common symptom. Lice or nits are usually found behind the ears and back of the head and neck. Nits are white in color and attach to the hair with a glue like substance and are hard to remove from the hare. Dandruff fall off easily. Notify school of any known or suspected cases.
- Sick day guidelines.

You should keep your child home if;

They have a fever of 99.6 degrees or higher, have been vomiting, have a productive cough, headache, body ache, earache, or a severe sore throat (A minor sore throat is usually not a problem, but a severe sore throat could be strep throat, even if there is no fever. Other symptoms of strep throat in children are headache and upset stomach. Your doctor will perform a test for strep).

Keep your student home until their fever has been gone for 24 hours without medication
